# THINGS TO KNOW

## *Should I tip?*

Tipping is customary at restaurants -- we would recommend leaving 15% or 20% tip.

## *Weather*

Mexico City's weather can be unpredictable, so bring a light jacket.

## *Is Mexico City Safe?*

Like any big city, be smart! Mexico City is safe, but it is a good bet to travel in groups and avoid walking alone, especially at night. You can use Uber to get around. If possible, leave any precious jewelry in the hotel safe until the day of the wedding.

## *Currency*

Most places accept cards, but it is always useful to have some cash for taxis, markets, and small vendors. Avoid exchanging money at the airport, as rates are usually higher. Instead, use Casa de Cambio Toka Internacional (Masaryk 360, Polanco) or Centro Cambiario Reforma (Av. Paseo de la Reforma 222, Juárez) for better rates.

## *Do I need an adapter?*

Mexico has the same outlets as the US.
